God's Loyal Love Changes Everything ("This Changes Everything" week #6)

MAIN POINT:

God cannot NOT love you!

KEY VERSE:

Psalm 136:1-26

BRING IT UP:

On Sunday, Pastor Nick continued concluded our This Changes Everything series by talking about love and the truth that God loves us and will love us forever! Love is one of those things that many people chase relentlessly. Some encounter love from a surface level and are let down by what they experience and how it's far from perfect. We learned that God loves us with a much deeper love and that love endures forever even if we deem ourselves unlovable! Nick's point was that God cannot NOT love you and that love is unchanging, unconditional and unstoppable. Our response to this love should be giving thanks to God! God's love in unchanging
