On Sunday, Pastor Nick continued in our End Times series by talking about two specific judgments on the end times timeline: The Bema Seat and The Great White Throne. When it comes to the topic of judgment, we naturally become a little bit defensive. "No one should be able to judge me", "Why, out of anyone, should God judge?" However, if we take the time to think over the many judgments that we often make in an instant, we come to realize that judgment is a natural and logical event. Nick taught us, when we think about judgment, that it doesn't have to scare you, it can secure you. There are two conditions that will flip judgment from scaring you to securing you: When Jesus is the forgiver of your sin and when He is the leader of your life. When you face judgment after death, you will be asked "What did you decide about Jesus?" and "How did you decide to live your life?". How will you respond? Your decisions determine your destiny!

- 1. When Jesus is the forgiver of your sin

- 2. When Jesus is the leader of your life
- ♦ Who is the Bema Seat judgment for?
- What will we be judged here?
- Why will the rewards received from this judgment be returned back to Jesus?

- ♦ In what way can you help those around you to be more secure regarding future judgment?
